Confused About Cash

Dear Confused About Cash,

Your trust is always producing returns in the form of dividends from stocks and interest from bonds. Most of this money is reinvested, but some is kept in 'cash'. When your reports say you have money in 'cash', it is not quite as it seems. Yes, there is some cash on hand (like the cash in your wallet) to pay the expenses of the trust, but most of the 'cash' is actually in an investment called money market funds. These money market funds are a collection of very short term (less than one year) investments like bonds, GICs, Treasury Bills, etc. These money market investments can be turned into real cash in a hurry, but when they are not needed immediately, the money in these funds does earn some return. So when you see 'cash' remember that the majority of that is actually invested and is making money for your trust.
