Congrats! That is quite a return. Your Trust money is governed by the Investment Policy Statement (IPS) which sets out rules and requirements for return and risk on investments. One of the stock selection criteria is historical performance. The Trust invests in companies which have a proven history of performance and have been around for at least 7 years. Most of the weed stocks are very new and have a high risk of failure. Investing the Trust's money in high risk stocks is not compliant with the rules set out in the Investment Policy Statement. Maybe later on the Trust may consider adding weed stocks which fulfill the selection criteria. Good luck on your investments!
